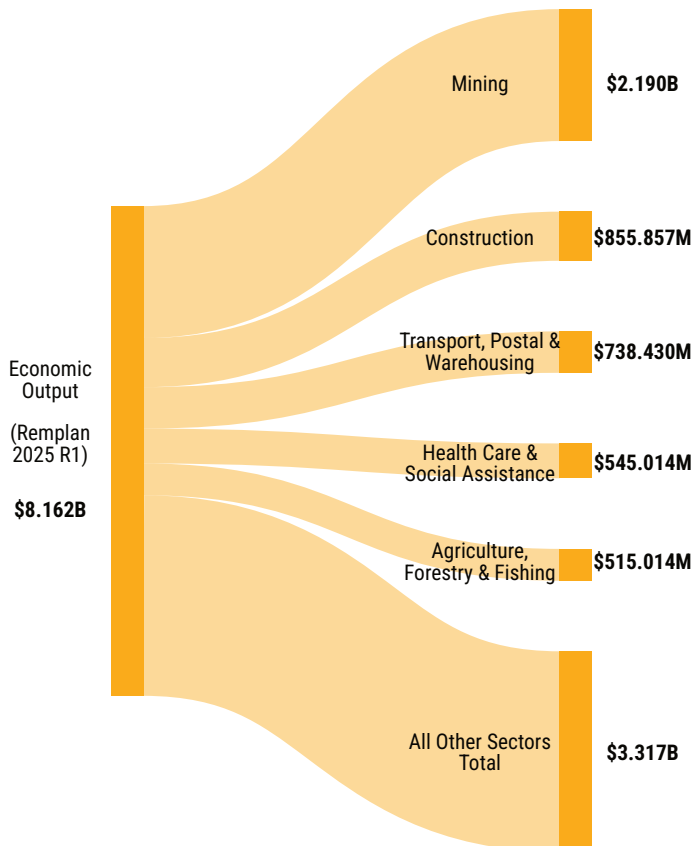

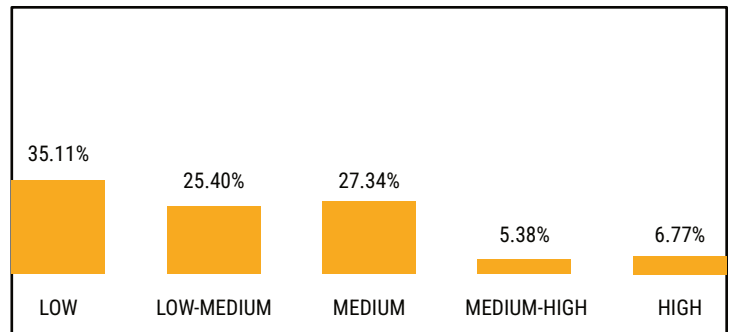

### KEY SECTORS BY ECONOMIC OUTPUT REF 1

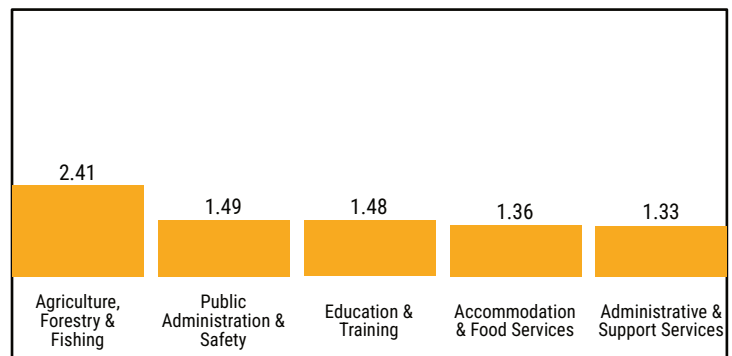


### ECONOMIC COMPLEXITY BY ECONOMIC OUTPUT REF 1

### KEY SECTORS LOCATION QUOTIENT: EMPLOYMENT REF 1



**Location Quotient** refers to the comparative advantage, or specialisation of a sector within a regions economy in comparison to Western Australia overall, **1 or more** being evidence of a higher comparative advantage and **below 1** being evidence of a lower comparative advantage or presence of a sector compared to Western Australia. **Gross Regional Product (GRP)** is the net measure of wealth generated by the region. GRP can be measured by using the incomes approach, where all incomes earned by individuals (wages and salaries), firms (gross operating surplus) and governments (taxes on products or services) are added. **Output** data represents the gross revenue generated by businesses/organisations in each of the industry sectors in a defined region. Gross revenue is also referred to as total sales or total income.

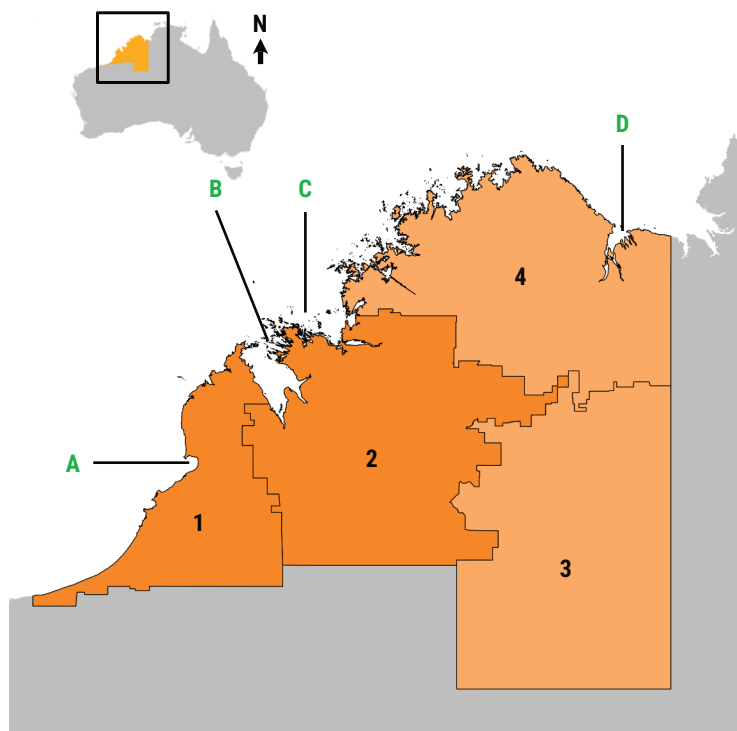

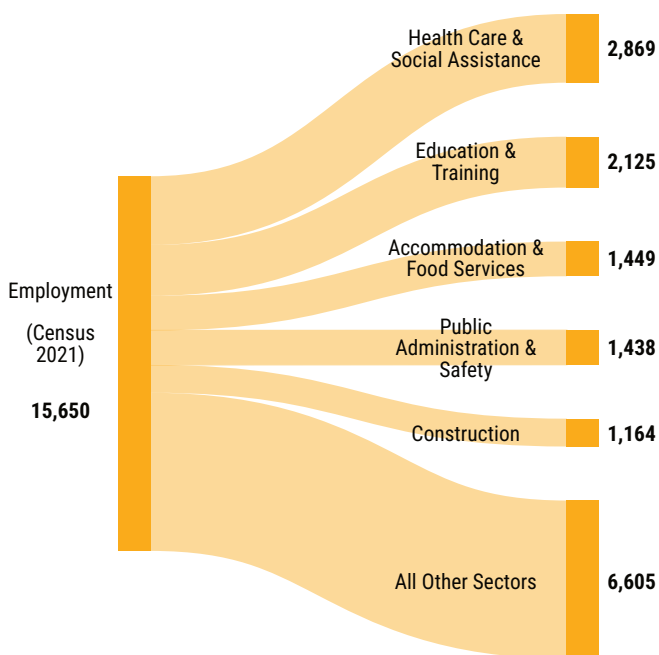

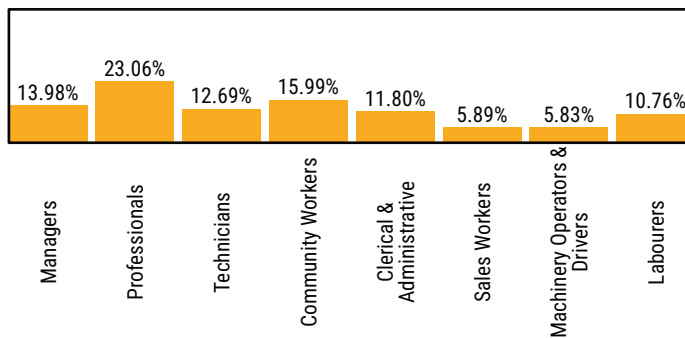
